MOTORCYCLE SAFETY CLASSES ENROLLMENT ELIGIBILITY and CLASS COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to enroll in any Motorcycle Safety training class at Virginia Peninsula Community College, you must:

- Know how to ride a bicycle;
- Be at least 4 feet; 11 inches tall; and
- Be at least 16 years old
 - For participants under 18 years of age:
 - Written parent/legal guardian permission is required; and
 - Parent/legal guardian must attend the first class meeting.
 - **NOTE:** *A motorcycle license will not be issued to anyone under the age of 19 who does not have an automotive operator's license.*

PLEASE BE CERTAIN TO BRING WITH YOU TO CLASS:

- Eye protection;
- Long-sleeve shirt or jacket;
- Long, non-flare pants made of denim (no holes or tears) or equivalent or more durable material;
- Sturdy over-the-ankle boots; and
- Full-finger gloves, preferably leather.
- Helmets are provided, but participants may bring their own helmet if preferred.
 - Participant provided helmets must be DOT compliant (3/4 or full face construction).

Due to safety concerns, participants who arrive in any inappropriate clothing for motorcycle riding will not be permitted to take part in field training.

Because this course is physically demanding, participants should be in good health. The instructor will make the final determination if any participant will be allowed to participate in the riding portion of the course. No refunds will be provided to participants with obvious health or physical issues that would prevent them from safely participating in the class. Interested participants who are uncertain about their physical capabilities should contact the Program Director for guidance at least 10 business days prior to class start date.

All course requirements must be met for successful completion. This includes advance completion of the online portion of the class (prior to class start); full attendance and participation at all class sessions and yard training activities (with appropriate clothing); and successful demonstration of skills mastery. The instructor makes the final determination of skills mastery, grade and eligibility for DMV testing waiver. No refunds or future class fee waivers will be provided to participants who do not successfully complete the class for any reason.

REQUESTS FOR WITHDRAWAL submitted in writing (e-mail to WFDInq@vpcc.edu will suffice) no later than three (3) full business days before class start will be granted a full refund or transfer to another class of equal or lesser value. (Friday class start date deadline is CoB the previous Tuesday; Saturday class start date deadline is CoB on the previous Wednesday (assuming no holiday closures during the week). No refunds or class transfers will be granted for late withdrawals.
